U.S. Sen. Lindsey Graham To Speak at NC State Millennium Seminar Series

U.S. Sen. Lindsey Graham (R-S.C.) will speak at North Carolina State University's Millennium Seminar Series with a presentation to students, faculty, staff and the general public at **2:30 p.m. on Tuesday, Oct. 17, in Stewart Theater on campus**. He will share his perspectives on leadership and the debate over torture, terrorism and America's place in the world.

Media coverage of the seminar is invited. The seminar is free and open to the public. Public parking is available in the parking deck located at the corner of Cates Avenue and Jeter Drive. Turn onto Pullen Road from either Hillsborough Street or Western Blvd. Turn onto Dunn Ave and take the second left turn onto Jeter Drive, and the next left into the Coliseum Parking Deck. Stewart Theater is on the second floor of the Talley Student Center west of the Coliseum Deck.

Graham is a leading expert on military justice and one of the key forces in helping pass a ban on torture. He has championed the Geneva Convention in the legislative debate over enemy combatants. Graham was elected to the U.S. House of Representatives in 1994 and the U.S. Senate in 2002. He serves on four Senate committees: Armed Services, Judiciary, Budget and Veterans Affairs.

Coordinated by Mary P. Easley, first lady of North Carolina and a senior lecturer at NC State, the Millennium Seminars are designed to provide context for global issues from the perspective of nationally and internationally recognized speakers. Four seminars are planned for each year; the theme for this year's seminars is "Innovation, Leadership and Higher Education."
