Holocaust Survivor David Faber to Speak at NC State University

Holocaust survivor David Faber will speak at 7 p.m. on Tuesday, Nov. 7, in North Carolina State University's Stewart Theatre.

Tickets are free and are required for admission. Pick up tickets in advance at the Center for Student Leadership and Public Service, located in 3115 Talley Student Center.

NC State is collaborating with Elon University and Meredith College to bring Faber to campus. Faber plans a weeklong visit in North Carolina as he continues his mission of Holocaust education to students, adults and their communities.

A prominent writer and speaker, Faber was born in Poland in 1926 and became a prisoner in 1939. After enduring life in seven concentration camps, including Auschwitz and Jawiszowice, Faber was liberated from Bergen-Belsen in 1945. He witnessed the murders of his parents, his older brother Romek and five of his six sisters. Faber has dedicated his life to educate people about the Holocaust and the nature of hate.

Faber lives with his wife in California and travels across the country speaking about his experiences during World War II. In memory of his brother, Faber published a documentary in 1997 titled "Because of Romek: A Holocaust Survivor's Memoir."
