

## NC STATE UNIVERSITY

**PURPOSE:** This award is developed to encourage and recognize outstanding international scholarship in teaching, research, extension, engagement and economic development by faculty and EPA professionals of North Carolina State University.

**ELIGIBILITY:** This is open to any current full-time faculty and EPA professionals of NC State University. Nominees should have a well-established and ongoing record of international activities while working at NC State. Such activities should include several of the following: individual and/or collaborative international research, teaching, promoting student international involvement, program development, international extension activities, service on international boards and task forces, consulting, publications and/or performances. Two awards will be made annually to NC State faculty and EPA professionals.

### TIMING FOR IMPLEMENTATION

A. The names of nominees selected by each college or unit, together with the supporting evidence in letter form, must be submitted to Chantell LaPan at [chantell\\_lapan@ncsu.edu](mailto:chantell_lapan@ncsu.edu) on or before **5:00 PM Monday, March 14, 2011.**

B. The award recipient(s) will be notified by letter no later than **Monday, April 11, 2011.**

C. The award will be presented at the [International Engagement Exposition](#) on **Tuesday April 26, 2011** at 3:00 PM at E. Carroll Joyner Visitor Center. Nominees and recipients of this award will be invited to present posters at the Expo about their global engagement activities from 2:00-5:00. The recipient(s) will be recognized with an award certificate and \$500 travel grant toward future international activities.

# OUTSTANDING GLOBAL ENGAGEMENT AWARD



### CRITERIA FOR AWARD

**Evidence of International Activity:** International partnership is a meaningful and beneficial collaboration between the University and partners and communities abroad. It is a global perspective that enables our graduates to be competitive in the work force, international research that advances our reputation as a leading university, and global extension and engagement that allows for meaningful impact in the lives of individuals throughout the world. Nominees for this award should have made important international contributions in several aspects of the university's mission.

• **Research and Discovery:** The extent to which the faculty or staff member's research has made a significant contribution to his/her discipline, through the creation or discovery of new knowledge and how that work involved international collaboration and activities.

• **Teaching and Learning:** The extent to which the faculty or staff member's teaching increased student awareness of international issues and involved them in academic activities abroad. The committee will also review the extent to which courses with international content (including study abroad courses) served as models for future courses in the curriculum.

• **Engagement, Extension and Economic Development:** The extent to which the international activities cited in the nomination raised NC State's profile as a major land-grant university, the benefits derived from them, and documented evidence of outcomes. Significant engagement programs, mentoring exchange partners, and economic development programs are to be included here.

• **Impacts and Accomplishments:** This section should document evaluated impacts of the nominee's international efforts upon the target audience(s), including the collaborators and NC State Community.

**LETTER OF NOMINATION:** The nomination letter should be submitted by the College Dean, College Director of International Programs, or unit administrator to Chantell LaPan at [chantell\\_lapan@ncsu.edu](mailto:chantell_lapan@ncsu.edu). The nomination packet should include the nominee's Curriculum Vitae and should emphasize the impact that the nominee's international activities have had on the NC State Community. The members of [International Operations Council](#) will review all nominees and make the final decision regarding award selections.
